CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSING BOARD OF NEW ZEALAND

The key matter for the Board as this report is prepared is the concern that cadastral survey datasets from many surveyors are not achieving full first time compliance with the requirements of Land Information New Zealand (LINZ).

The Board has resolved to work collaboratively with the profession and the Surveyor-General to gain a better understanding of the reasons for the high requisition rate for cadastral survey datasets when they are first lodged with LINZ. There is an acknowledgement from both the public and private sectors that improvements should occur. The Board will be involved to ensure that the ongoing competency standards are maintained and reassessed to meet the future requirements.

Licence Renewal

The Board has continued its efforts to streamline the annual renewal process for a License to undertake cadastral surveys by providing simpler and clearer application forms and guidelines. The main change was to improve the format to ensure that the competency of a surveyor could be more thoroughly assessed, particularly if a surveyor is not regularly lodging datasets with LINZ. The Board will assess the effectiveness of these changes before the licence renewal process begins next year.

Changes in Board Personnel

The past year has seen some changes in the Board's membership. Dr Don Grant retired as the Surveyor-General in December 2013. Mark Smith became the Surveyor-General's nominee on the Board until Mark Dyer's appointment as the new Surveyor-General in March 2014. The Board formally records its appreciation of Dr Grant's outstanding contribution during his ten years in his role. It farewelled him with a lunch in December and wished him well in his new academic career in Melbourne

The Board also recognises the very valuable contribution of lay member Felicity Price, who resigned from the Board in March 2014, after nearly five years service. Marion Miller the previous substitute lay member has since been appointed in the role.

Jeremy Maseyk, the Board's secretary for over five years, announced his intention to retire in July. Jeremy has played a very significant role in ensuring the Board runs efficiently and that surveyors and members of the public retain a high level of confidence in the Board. After publicly advertising the position, the Board appointed Phil Napper, a surveyor from Dunedin, as the new secretary. There will be a handover period where Jeremy will act in an advisory role to the new Secretary.

Jurisdiction

The Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand is constituted by section 10 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002.

Functions

The functions and duties undertaken by the Board are set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act. (See Appendix A).

In summary, the primary function of the Board is the licensing of suitably qualified surveyors with current competence to conduct cadastral surveys and lodge them in the cadastral record. For this purpose, the Board sets standards for the education and the practical experience required to obtain and retain a cadastral licence.

The Board exercises disciplinary powers in cases where a cadastral surveyor is charged with negligence, incompetence, falsification, or failure to observe the Rules for Cadastral Survey. The Board has the authority to suspend or cancel a licence, or place a surveyor under the supervision of another licensed cadastral surveyor, where professional misconduct is proven. In addition, the Board participates in reciprocity arrangements with the eight Australian State and Territory boards.

Membership

Under section 13 of the Act there are five board members appointed by the Minister of Land Information.

In December 2013, the Surveyor-General, Dr Don Grant, retired from the Board as he had resigned his position as Surveyor-General. Mark Dyer the newly appointed Surveyor-General replaces him on the Board.

In March 2014 the lay member of the Board, Felicity Price, resigned. Marion Miller the previous substitute lay member has since been appointed as the new lay member.

The present Board members are:

- Mr Brett Douglas Gawn and Ms Vicki Alma Nalder, appointed as nominees of bodies representing licensed cadastral surveyors pursuant to section 13(2)(a);
- Ms Merryn Kay Maguire and Mr Anthony Paul Nikkel appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(b);
- Ms Katharine Margaret Felicity Price, until March 2014, being a person who is not and never has been a licensed cadastral surveyor and is not employed in the surveying profession is appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(c);
- Surveyor-General, Dr Donald Bruce Grant, until December 2013, as an *ex-officio* member of the Board pursuant to section 13(1)(b);
- Surveyor-General, Mark Dyer, from April 2014, as an *ex-officio* member of the Board pursuant to section 13(1)(b)
- Mr Neale Charles Thomas Faulkner and Ms Marion Grace Miller are substitute members of the Board.

Meetings

The Board met four times in the 2013/14 year, on:

1 August 2013
6 December 2013
14 February 2014
13 June 2014.

Licences

The table below shows the number of licences issued and non-renewals over the last five years. In the table:

- “Renewed” means the number of licenses renewed at 30 June 2013
- “New” means the number of initial licenses issued during the year.
- “Re-applied” means the number of licenses issued to surveyors who failed to renew by 30 of June 2013 or had let their licence lapse for some time.
- “Non-renewals” means surveyors who chose not to renew their licenses and deceased surveyors.

The 662 licensed surveyors are made up of 56 females and 606 males. The number of females continues to increase steadily and is up from 53 last year and 43 in 2011.

The continued reduction in the number of licences issued is not of concern to the Board, given the current level of cadastral surveying activity. The Board expects that the number of surveyors holding a licence to remain stable around 650 for the next few years.

The Board is heartened that the 30–39 age band is the second largest group. As surveyors are generally in their mid twenties before they have completed their qualifications and experience requirements for licensing, it is not a concern that the number of licensed surveyors in their twenties is only 31. The 30-39 age group is more important in terms of monitoring the number of licensed surveyors to meet future demand.

The under-representation of Maori is noted. The survey profession as a whole needs to address this issue and is doing so.

The Board issued Letters of Accreditation to eight New Zealand surveyors seeking registration in an Australian State, compared to 14 in 2012/13, 17 in 2011/12, 18 in 2010/11, four in 2009/10 and seven in 2008/09. This reflects the demand for New Zealand surveyors in Australia although this trend appears to be reversing with the reduced demand in the mining industry and a slowing Australian economy.

This year the Board recognised surveying degrees from the Czech Republic, Greece and the Philippines as meeting its standards for licensing. In most cases when applicants present surveying degrees from countries other than New Zealand or Australia these degrees are assessed by the Bureau of Assessment of Overseas Qualifications to establish if they meet the Board's standards for licensing. Since 2002, the Bureau has assessed degrees from the Czech Republic, France, Greece, Mauritius, Philippines, South Africa (Natal), UK, and USA (Minnesota) as being equivalent to a four year surveying degree in New Zealand or Australia.

Discipline

The Board received two complaints relating to the conduct of surveyors, from private individuals not associated with the surveying profession. After investigation, the Board did not accept either complaint.

The Surveyor-General advised the Board of 18 notices of a significant failure to comply with his standards in accordance with section 7(1)(d) of the Act during the year, compared to 15 in 2012/13, one in 2011/12 and seven in 2010/11. The Board monitors the surveyors who have been notified to the Board under this section in the previous three years. As part of this monitoring, the Board takes a more in depth review of these surveyors on a case by case basis before deciding whether to renew their licences. In some cases, the Board will ask applicants' for additional information to confirm their competency before renewing their licence.

Licensing Standards

The Board has continued to recognise the admissions interviews conducted by the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors Incorporated as evidence that applicants for initial licences meet the standards of competencies adopted by the Board. The Board monitors the conduct of these examinations.

The Board refined its licence renewal process for the 2014/15 licensing year. Applicants who have not lodged three cadastral survey datasets in the previous three years, or have not practiced in the areas covered by the standards, are required to support their application with additional information to demonstrate their competency in cadastral surveying. The Board elaborated on the guidelines for the information it expects from applicants. This refinement improved the efficiency and timeliness of the licence renewal process and provided more clarity for applicants.

As part of its responsibilities to monitor academic qualifications and practical requirements for the licensing of surveyors, the Board maintains contact with the National School of Surveying at the University of Otago, the only university in New Zealand that offers degrees in surveying.

Reciprocity

Full reciprocity between the New Zealand surveyors' boards and the eight Australian State and Territory surveyors' boards has existed since 1901, although a reciprocity agreement with Australian boards had existed from 1892. The Board collaborates with the Australian boards on the assessment of other overseas qualifications for equivalence to the New Zealand and Australian degrees and setting policies for the education, training, and regulation of surveyors.

Contact with the Australian boards is maintained directly at board level through the Council of the Reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand (CRSBANZ), comprising the Chairs of each board. Meetings of the Council are generally held once per year. The last meeting was held in Adelaide in October 2013. The Council held one teleconference in February 2014.

This year CRSBANZ published *The Attributes of a Surveying Degree for Australia and New Zealand* that updates the guidelines that it uses to measure academic surveying qualifications provided by tertiary education institutions. Copies of this publication are available from the Board for anyone interested.

Finance

The Board is funded entirely by licensing fees gathered annually from licensed cadastral surveyors. The level of those fees is set by the Board under section 11(1)(c) of the Act. Operating costs have been kept under tight control and the financial statements show a small surplus. The Board has held the licence fee at \$184 for the 2014/15 year, which is \$27.50 lower than when the Board was established in 2002.

Administration

The Board continues to contract the Institute of Professional Engineers New Zealand (IPENZ) to provide administrative services, office facilities, and meeting rooms.

IPENZ maintains full time office hours, a dedicated telephone and facsimile point of contact, and hosts the Board's website. This is considered to be a very valuable and efficient arrangement for the Board and public.

Mr Robert Buchanan of Wellington acts as the Board's legal adviser, and Mr Jeremy Maseyk was contracted as the Board Secretary until 30 June 2014.

APPENDIX A: FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES

The functions and duties of the board, as set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002 are:

- (a) To maintain a register of cadastral surveyors licensed under this Act.
- (b) To receive applications for licences under this Act as cadastral surveyors and to issue licences in proper cases.
- (c) To set fees for the issue and renewal of licences under this Act.
- (d) To issue and update standards that persons applying for licences, or the renewal of licences, under this Act must be met.
- (e) To investigate complaints about cadastral surveyors and take disciplinary action in appropriate cases under this Act.
- (f) To provide statistical information to the Minister about cadastral surveyors as requested by the Minister.
- (g) To perform such other functions or duties conferred on it by this Act or any other enactment.

APPENDIX B: AUDIT REPORT

To the Members of Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand

Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the financial statements of Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand on pages 10 to 14, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2014, and the statement of financial performance, statement of movements in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

Board Members' Responsibilities

The board members are responsible for the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand and for such internal control as the board members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

Auditor's Responsibilities

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation of financial statements that present fairly the matters to which they relate in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, as well as evaluating the presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.





NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2014

1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES

a. Reporting Entity

The financial statements presented here are for the reporting entity Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand (CSLB) which commenced operations on 1 June 2002.

b. Reporting Basis

The CSLB is required to prepare financial statements pursuant to Section 19 Cadastral Survey Act 2002 and in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices.

c. Measurement Base

The measurement base adopted is historical cost.

d. Specific Accounting Policies

(i) The Financial Statements are prepared in accordance with the New Zealand generally accepted accounting practice

(ii) Differential Reporting

The CSLB is a qualifying entity within the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand Differential Reporting Framework. The Board qualifies under the size criteria and because it is not publicly accountable. The Board has taken advantage of all differential reporting exemptions available to it except for Financial Reporting Standard 10 Statement of Cash Flows.

(iii) Goods and Service Tax

The Statement of Financial Position and Performance have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.

(iv) Taxation

The entity is exempt from income tax on the basis that it falls under Section CW38 of the Income Tax Act 2007.

(v) Changes in Accounting Policies

There have been no changes in the accounting policies. All policies have been applied on basis consistent with those used in previous years.

2. NATURE AND ACTIVITIES OF THE BOARD

The Board was established by and operates under the Cadastral Survey Act 2002. This Act requires cadastral surveys to be carried out by, or under the direction of, a licensed cadastral surveyor, who must meet the standards for competence and licensing set by the board.

3. ANNUAL CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSE FEES

Annual Cadastral Surveyors License Certificates expire on 30 June each year. Applications for renewal each year may be lodged at any time after 1 April for the following twelve month period commencing 1 July.

A number of applications for renewal are received and paid in advance during the period between 1 April and 30 June each year. These license fees received in advance are shown separately on the Statement of Financial Position and are taken up as income in the financial year to which they relate.

4. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The CSLB had no contingent liabilities as at balance date. (2013 Nil)

5. COMMITMENTS

The CSLB had no commitments as at balance date. (2013 Nil)

6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the year the CSLB has had no related party transactions. No related party debts have been written off or forgiven during the year.
