## **CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSING BOARD OF NEW ZEALAND**

### **Introduction**

The Board continues its focus from the previous year on working with the profession and the Surveyor-General to improve the first time compliance by surveyors when they lodge cadastral surveys at LINZ. It is proving a challenge and there is a recognition that some of this may be a Rules and Landonline system issue. But the Board still believes surveyors need to lift their performance in this area.

Another continuing focus is the licence renewal process that is an administrative burden on the Board, and some surveyors find the criteria a bit difficult to follow. The Board will be investigating on-line renewal to improve the licence renewal process.

The Board is pleased to see that the number of licences issued during the year is slightly higher than last year, reversing a long downward trend. The renewed activity in the housing market and other land development has seen an increase in demand for cadastral surveyors. This is expected to continue for the next few years meaning that the Board expects to see an upsurge in the number of graduate surveyors achieving its standards for obtaining an initial licence.

The Board received an increase in the number of complaints against cadastral surveyors who had allegedly failed to meet the required standards for cadastral survey, including a number from members of the public who felt their boundaries had not been correctly defined. Some of these have been particularly complex requiring considerable effort by the Board to understand the real issues raised and then decide if the problem is professional misconduct, survey error, or differences of professional opinion between surveyors.

The Board has advised LINZ of some areas of the Cadastral Survey Act that could be improved when the Government next decides to amend the Cadastral Survey Act.

The Board has incurred a one off increase in secretarial costs as the previous secretary handed over the role to the new secretary over the first part of the financial year. This has caused the financial deficit. A small increase in fees should see the Board return to a balance position in the 2015/16 year.

### **Jurisdiction**

The Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand is constituted by section 10 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002.

### **Functions**

The functions and duties undertaken by the Board are set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act. (See Appendix A).

In summary, the primary function of the Board is the licensing of suitably qualified surveyors with current competence to conduct cadastral surveys and lodge them in the cadastral record. For this purpose, the Board sets standards for the education and the practical experience required to obtain and retain a cadastral licence.

The Board exercises disciplinary powers in cases where a cadastral surveyor is charged with negligence, incompetence, falsification, or failure to observe the Rules for Cadastral Survey. The Board has the authority to suspend or cancel a licence, or place a surveyor under the supervision of another licensed cadastral surveyor, where professional misconduct is proven.

Licences are renewed annually.

In addition, the Board participates in reciprocity arrangements with the eight Australian State and Territory boards.

## Membership

Under section 13 of the Act there are five board members appointed by the Minister of Land Information.

The present Board members are:

- Mr Brett Douglas Gawn and Ms Vicki Alma Nalder, appointed as nominees of bodies representing licensed cadastral surveyors pursuant to section 13(2)(a);
- Ms Merryn Kay Maguire and Mr Anthony Paul Nikkel appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(b);
- Ms Marion Grace Miller, being a person who is not and never has been a licensed cadastral surveyor and is not employed in the surveying profession is appointed pursuant to section 13(2)(c);
- Surveyor-General, Mark Dyer, from April 2014, as an *ex-officio* member of the Board pursuant to section 13(1)(b);
- Mr Neale Charles Thomas Faulkner is a substitute member of the Board.

## Meetings

The Board met four times in the 2014/15 year, on:

5 December 2014  
5 March 2015  
4 June 2015.

## Licences

The table below shows the number of licences issued and non-renewals over the last five years. In the table:

- “Renewed” means the number of licenses renewed at 30 June 2014.
- “New” means the number of initial licenses issued during the year.
- “Re-applied” means the number of licenses issued to surveyors who failed to renew by 30 of June 2014 or had let their licence lapse for some time.
- “Non-renewals” means surveyors who chose not to renew their licenses and deceased surveyors.

The 664 licensed surveyors are made up of 56 females and 608 males. The number of females is the same as 2014, but is an increase from 53 in 2013 and 43 in 2011. The slight increase in the number of licences issued is encouraging, given the trend of reducing numbers in previous years. The Board expects that the number of surveyors holding a licence to rise slightly over the next few years as demand for cadastral surveyors increases.

The 30–39 age band is now the largest group, showing an increase of 13 surveyors from 2014. This is important in terms of monitoring the number of licensed surveyors to meet future demand.

The number of younger surveyors in the 20-29 age band is 4 less than 2014, despite the number of BSurv graduates increasing. This may reflect the increasing number of survey graduates who are involved in non – cadastral surveying activities including in the spatial industry. We would expect the number completing their pre-requisite experience to obtain a license to increase with the increased activity in housing development. The under-representation of Maori remains a concern considering the increase in land development activities of Maori businesses. The survey profession as a whole needs to address these issues and is doing so.

The Board issued Letters of Accreditation to 5 New Zealand surveyors seeking registration in Australian States which continues the downward trend since the high of 18 in 2010/11. This reflects the reduced demand in Australia. The Board approved 3 Licence applications from surveyors returning from Australia to practise in New Zealand.

This year the Board recognised surveying degrees from Greece and the Philippines as meeting its standards for licensing. In most cases when applicants present surveying degrees from countries other than New Zealand or Australia these degrees are assessed by the Bureau of Assessment of Overseas Qualifications to establish if they meet the Board's standards for licensing. Since 2002, the Bureau has assessed degrees from the Czech Republic, France, Greece, Mauritius, Philippines, South Africa (Natal), UK, and USA (Minnesota) as being equivalent to a four year surveying degree in New Zealand or Australia.

### **Discipline**

The Board received four complaints relating to the conduct of surveyors from private individuals not associated with the surveying profession. After investigation, the Board did not accept any of these complaints.

The Board received three complaints relating to the conduct of surveyors from the Surveyor-General. Two complaints were accepted and proceeded to a disciplinary hearing, while one is still under investigation. Of the complaints that proceeded to disciplinary hearings, one was upheld and the surveyor was found guilty of professional misconduct in terms of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002; and the other was dismissed.

The Surveyor-General advised the Board of 15 notices of a significant failure to comply with his standards in accordance with section 7(1)(d) of the Act during the year, compared to 18 in 2013/14, 15 in 2012/13 and 1 in 2011/12. The Board monitors the surveyors who have been notified to the Board under this section in the previous three years. As part of this monitoring, the Board takes a more in depth review of these surveyors on a case by case basis before deciding whether to renew their licences. In

some cases, the Board has asked applicants for additional information to confirm their competency before renewing their licence.

### **Licensing Standards**

The Board has continued to recognise the admissions interviews conducted by the New Zealand Institute of Surveyors Incorporated (NZIS) as evidence that applicants for initial licences meet the standards of competencies adopted by the Board. The Board monitors the conduct of these examinations and is working with NZIS to ensure these remain reflective of current surveying practice.

As part of its responsibilities to monitor academic qualifications and practical requirements for the licensing of surveyors, the Board maintains contact with the National School of Surveying at the University of Otago, the only university in New Zealand that offers degrees in surveying.

### **Reciprocity**

Full reciprocity between the New Zealand surveyors' boards and the eight Australian State and Territory surveyors' boards has existed since 1901, although a reciprocity agreement with Australian boards had existed from 1892. The Board also collaborates with the Australian boards on the assessment of other overseas qualifications for equivalence to the New Zealand and Australian degrees and setting policies for the education, training, and regulation of surveyors.

Contact with the Australian boards is maintained directly at board level through the Council of the Reciprocating Surveyors Boards of Australia and New Zealand (CRSBANZ), comprising the Chairs of each board. Meetings of the Council are generally held once per year, however this year two meetings were held. The last meeting was held in Brisbane in March 2015. As the Chairman could not attend, Mark Dyer represented the Board at the meeting. The Council held one teleconference in June 2015.

### **Finance**

The Board is funded entirely by licensing fees gathered annually from licensed cadastral surveyors. The level of those fees is set by the Board under section 11(1)(c) of the Act. Operating costs are being kept under tight control but there has been a one off increase in secretarial costs this year. The Board felt it important to ensure a smooth hand-over of secretarial duties so invited the retiring Mr Maseyk to undertake a project with the new secretary to refine and document its administrative procedures to improve efficiencies in future. This has led to a deficit for the financial year. Where a disciplinary hearing is held and the surveyor is found not guilty, as happened this year, the Board does not recover hearing costs and has to absorb these costs. The Board decided to increase the licence fee from \$184 to \$194 for the 2015/16 year. This small increase, the first since 2011, is now required to achieve a balanced budget in 2015/16.

### **Administration**

The Board continues to contract the Institute of Professional Engineers New Zealand (IPENZ) to provide administrative services, office facilities, and meeting rooms. IPENZ maintains full time office hours, dedicated telephone and email point of contact, and hosts the Board's website. This is considered to be a very valuable arrangement for the Board. A review of the website in conjunction with the licence renewal process is currently under consideration for the coming year.

Mr Robert Buchanan of Wellington acts as the Board's legal adviser, and Mr Phil Napper is contracted as the Board Secretary. The previous secretary, Mr Jeremy Maseyk, retired but stayed in an advisory role until December 2014.

**APPENDIX A: FUNCTIONS AND DUTIES**

The functions and duties of the board, as set out in section 11 of the Cadastral Survey Act 2002 are:

- (a) To maintain a register of cadastral surveyors licensed under this Act.
- (b) To receive applications for licences under this Act as cadastral surveyors and to issue licences in proper cases.
- (c) To set fees for the issue and renewal of licences under this Act.
- (d) To issue and update standards that persons applying for licences, or the renewal of licences, under this Act must meet.
- (e) To investigate complaints about cadastral surveyors and take disciplinary action in appropriate cases under this Act.
- (f) To provide statistical information to the Minister about cadastral surveyors as requested by the Minister.
- (g) To perform such other functions or duties conferred on it by this Act or any other enactment.



**APPENDIX B: AUDIT REPORT****To the Members of Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand****Report on the financial statements**

We have audited the financial statements of Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand on pages 10 to 14, which comprise the statement of financial position as at 30 June 2015, and the statement of financial performance, statement of movements in equity and statement of cash flows for the year then ended, and a summary of significant accounting policies and other explanatory information.

**Board Members' responsibilities**

The board members are responsible for the preparation of financial statements in accordance with generally accepted accounting practice in New Zealand and for such internal control as the board members determine is necessary to enable the preparation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

**Auditor's responsibilities**

Our responsibility is to express an opinion on these financial statements based on our audit. We conducted our audit in accordance with International Standards on Auditing (New Zealand). Those standards require that we comply with ethical requirements and plan and perform the audit to obtain reasonable assurance about whether the financial statements are free from material misstatement.

An audit involves performing procedures to obtain audit evidence about the amounts and disclosures in the financial statements. The procedures selected depend on the auditor's judgement, including the assessment of the risks of material misstatement of the financial statements, whether due to fraud or error. In making those risk assessments, the auditor considers internal control relevant to the entity's preparation of financial statements that present fairly the matters to which they relate in order to design audit procedures that are appropriate in the circumstances, but not for the purpose of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the entity's internal control.

An audit also includes evaluating the appropriateness of accounting policies used and the reasonableness of accounting estimates, as well as evaluating the presentation of the financial statements.

We believe that the audit evidence we have obtained is sufficient and appropriate to provide a basis for our audit opinion.

Other than in our capacity as auditor we have no relationship with, or interests in Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand.

**NOTES TO THE FINANCIAL STATEMENTS**  
**FOR THE YEAR ENDED 30 JUNE 2015**

**1. STATEMENT OF ACCOUNTING POLICIES**

a. Reporting Entity

The financial statements presented here are for the reporting entity Cadastral Surveyors Licensing Board of New Zealand (CSLB) which commenced operations on 1 June 2002.

b. Reporting Basis

The CSLB is required to prepare financial statements pursuant to Section 19 Cadastral Survey Act 2002 and in accordance with generally accepted accounting practices.

c. Measurement Base

The measurement base adopted is historical cost.

d. Specific Accounting Policies

- (i) The Financial Statements are prepared in accordance with the New Zealand generally accepted accounting practice
- (ii) Differential Reporting  
The CSLB is a qualifying entity within the Institute of Chartered Accountants of New Zealand Differential Reporting Framework. The Board qualifies under the size criteria and because it is not publicly accountable. The Board has taken advantage of all differential reporting exemptions available to it except for Financial Reporting Standard 10 Statement of Cash Flows, and FRS-19 Goods and Services Tax.
- (iii) Goods and Service Tax  
The Statement of Financial Position and Performance have been prepared on a GST exclusive basis.
- (iv) Taxation  
The entity is exempt from income tax on the basis that it falls under Section CW38 of the Income Tax Act 2007.
- (v) Revenue Recognition Policy  
Revenue is recognised to the extent that it is probable that the economic benefits flow to CSBL and revenues can be reliably measured.  
  
Annual subscriptions are invoiced in April each year. License fees received in advance are recognised in the financial year the license relates to.
- (vi) Changes in Accounting Policies  
There have been no changes in the accounting policies. All policies have been applied on a basis consistent with those used in previous years.

**2. NATURE AND ACTIVITIES OF THE BOARD**

The Board was established by and operates under the Cadastral Survey Act 2002. This Act requires cadastral surveys to be carried out by, or under the direction of, a licensed cadastral surveyor, who must meet the standards for competence and licensing set by the board.

**3. ANNUAL CADASTRAL SURVEYORS LICENSE FEES**

Cadastral Surveyors Licenses expire on 30 June each year. Applications for renewal may be lodged at any time after 1 April for the following twelve month period commencing 1 July.

A number of applications for renewal are received and paid in advance during the period between 1 April and 30 June each year. These license fees received in advance are shown separately on the Statement of Financial Position and are taken up as income in the financial year to which they relate.

#### 4. CONTINGENT LIABILITIES

The CSLB had no contingent liabilities as at balance date. (2014 Nil)

#### 5. COMMITMENTS

The CSLB had no commitments as at balance date. (2014 Nil)

#### 6. RELATED PARTY TRANSACTIONS

During the year the CSLB has had no related party transactions. No related party debts have been written off or forgiven during the year.
